Meet a Board Member - Carlton "Skip" Measley, President



Carlton "Skip" Measley was unanimously elected President at the 2019 Annual Meeting. A Hammonton native, Skip is no stranger to Oak Grove Cemetery.

Generations of Measleys are buried among the Oaks and that's what

makes him an ideal fit for his position.

"I have a lot of family here and it's important that I maintain the legacy of the cemetery. Not just for my family but for every family" says Skip. As a May 1979 graduate of Cumberland County College, Skip earned an Associate in Science degree in Horticulture.

This knowledge has proved invaluable as the board discusses landscaping upgrades (like trees) for the property.

It no doubt also came in handy to help him win 1st prize in August 2013 for his blueberry wine.

Skip is the owner/operator of Piney Hollow Farm blueberry farm, which has been in existence since 1939. He is married with two daughters, Heather and Amanda, and two grandchildren, Giana and David.

Meet a Resident - Paschal N. Parkhurst



The first deed ever written for Oak Grove Cemetery is dated March 8th, 1869. The deed number is "one" even though the lot number is 139.

Paschal N. Parkurst was born November 16, 1810 in Milford, MA. He married Elizabeth "Eliza" Hero on

October 18, 1833. They raised their family of three children in Milford. Their daughter, Susanna, succumbed to typhoid fever in 1849 at the age of 15. Shortly thereafter, the Parkhurst family migrated to Mullica Twp with their two sons, Merrill and Luman. In 1860, Paschal was one in a group of men who established the Trustees of Oak Grove Cemetery Association. Another, was his son Merrill.

Luman went on to be a Civil War hero, injured in Fredricksburg.

Paschal passed away on October 2, 1871. He and Eliza are buried side by side in the Parkurst family plot in Section C



at the entrance from Old Forks Road.
